MINISTER'S LETTER

Dear Friends

"Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8)

It's that time of year when we try to get out and about - that strange period called 'summer' but we know as British people we still cannot rely on the weather. How is it that when we do outdoor events you can guarantee it will rain. Then, of course, there's always 'Bank Holiday weather'! In the musical, Annie sings 'the sun will come out tomorrow, bet your bottom dollar' - she obviously wasn't British! At least she goes on to sing something quite poignant 'tomorrow, tomorrow, I love you, tomorrow, you're only a day away!'

According to James Bond, 'Tomorrow never dies' and although the filmmakers didn't mean it that way, it is a truism. Tomorrow is always tomorrow! And yet there's something about hope when we speak about tomorrow. Annie sings out of hope that tomorrow will be better than today. I wonder if as Christians our hope in tomorrow ever touches today? At the General Church Meeting I was encouraging people to begin to think about what tomorrow may bring. There were some real statements of hope and challenge. I wonder what your hope for tomorrow is? And yet, I know that we cannot live in tomorrow. As I have already said, there is always tomorrow. I wonder how many of you have ever said things like 'I'll start saving tomorrow', 'I'll begin that diet tomorrow', 'I'll read my Bible more tomorrow'. The problem with statements like that is that they are full of good intentions but will they ever come to pass. As Christians we believe in a God who is the same yesterday, today and forever. Our hopes and dreams need to rest in him. It is so easy to think we know the right way forward without God.

What will tomorrow bring for you? What are your hopes and dreams for your life, your family, your church? We can never truly know, can we. As Søren Kierkegaard, the 18th Century Danish philosopher once said, 'Life can only be understood backwards, but it has to be lived forwards'. Tomorrow doesn't make sense without our reference to yesterday! In Christian terms, this is all about vision. Christian vision looks to all that God is laying on our hearts but it has to be built on the rock of all that has gone on in our lives before it. What of your yesterdays is guiding your life as you consider your tomorrows?

And yet we need to remember Annie, tomorrow is 'only a day away'! Vision isn't just something that will guide us into the future but reminds us that there is an urgency for us to share the Good News of Jesus; we can never know what today will bring, never mind tomorrow so why do we prevaricate when we feel God is calling us to reach out? All we have is today. In fact, all we have is 'now'. To God, our now is his yesterday, today and forever. As Michael Card, an American Christian Singer-Songwriter once wrote that in Jesus 'eternity stepped into time so we could understand'.

So what is your tomorrow? And, more importantly, what is God laying on your heart to do today? All we have is now and as we seek to fulfil God's calling on our lives in the 'now' we will begin to build up a true sense of God's vision for our lives. Maybe now is the time to bring all your time before the God of eternity and allow him to show that not only is there a chance that the sun will come out tomorrow but it may also come out today!

Elizabeth Wang was a UK based Catholic artist and writer, born in 1942 and died in 2016. She became disillusioned with Anglicanism when a teenager and stopped going to church. At the age of 21 she became a practising Christian and converted to Catholicism at the age of 25. She was a prolific artist who is perhaps most famous for her religious paintings and her writings about prayer. She founded Radiant Light, which is a movement within the Catholic Church that seeks to encourage people to grow in holiness by believing and living the Catholic faith in its fullness. Jesus Christ Himself is 'the radiant light of God's glory' (Hebr. 1:3).

FROM OUR PASTORAL SECRETARY

What good are gloves without hands?

I recently had a meeting with Rev. Ben and Rev. Ann to review our pastoral visiting scheme at Wesley Chapel. It was an excellent and uplifting time of sharing and during this I reflected on some words from Jennifer Rees Larcombe's book *No hands but ours*.

'The list was daunting. Most of those items on the list were my problems, not just other people's. Thankfully I realised it was time to go and meet the children from school and I pulled on my coat and woolly hat. There on the washing machine lay my gloves, limp and lifeless – no use to anyone: but as I put my hands inside them, suddenly they took on a new life.

'Don't worry about your limitations', God seemed to say. I'm not asking you to love people in your own strength. All I want is for you to be like those limp gloves. I have no human body now so let me put myself into you, just as you put your hands into these gloves. Then I can work for people through you. Even if you feel inadequate, I can still use you'.

I bless the assurance of these words and the affirmation of just how important our pastoral support is to so many within Wesley Chapel and beyond.

The memorial service for the late Michael Crosby (former headmaster of Ashville) is to take place at Ashville College on Sunday, 7 July at 3 pm. Some in Wesley will remember Michael and his family when they were part of our congregation in the 1980s and 1990s, and Helen and Peter were in the Junior Church.

The descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles and Mary at Pentecost by Elizabeth Wang continued.

She exhibited at the Royal Academy and the Royal Institute of Painters and held solo exhibitions at Westminster Cathedral, the Bar Convent Museum in York and the Oxford University Catholic Chaplaincy, as well as various schools and parishes around the country. Before turning to religious painting Wang painted flowers, landscapes and occasionally portraits. She admired artists such as Modigliani and Singer Sargent. When prayer became her main theme she began painting in oils and her inspiration became the Swiss painter Johannes Itten.

The painting depicts the scene at Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles. The seventh Sunday after Easter when we celebrate Whitsuntide, is traditionally associated with baptisms and weddings. The white garments worn on these occasions give the day its name. However, Elizabeth Wang's painting is ablaze with colour, and even though the standing figures are still, the painting is alive with movement. As the Holy Spirit descends with dramatic energy, the figures of Mary and the apostles when touched with the fame, become alight themselves and their flames flow heavenwards. Light is the common factor in all Wang's paintings.

WESLEY CENTRE MALTON

A few weeks ago members from Wesley Centre Malton visited Wesley Centre Harrogate to give us the benefit of their experiences. Malton's newly re-branded Wesley Centre is a Grade II*listed Methodist chapel of national significance. The chapel has dodged closure several times, particularly after its roof collapsed in 2015. A £1m Appeal is underway to transform the building into a community hub to feature a fine concert hall. A central part of its planned refurbishment is the restoration of a historic pipe organ as its centrepiece.

Broadcaster Selina Scott is supporting the Appeal to create a sustainable and multiuse venue for the community. Selina Scott said: 'Malton, and its Methodist church, is dear to my heart. My grandfather who was born in the middle of the 19th century was a well-known Wesleyan lay preacher. So often, we've seen beautiful buildings like this wrecked, often completely gutted and turned into pubs or supermarkets.'

An evening with Julian Lloyd Webber is planned for 15 June 2019 and tickets are now on sale for a very special evening. The world famous musician will take audiences on a musical journey featuring clips from his extraordinary life with luminaries such as Cleo Lane and Yehudi Menhuin, as well as music with his brother, Andrew. Julian Lloyd Webber's wife, the acclaimed cellist Jiaxin Lloyd Webber, and pianist Pam Chowhan will perform music closely associated with Lloyd Webber's life. Julian Lloyd Webber said: 'It will be a fun evening. There will be a Q&A session where people are free to ask me anything they want – well yes, pretty much!'

Paul Emberley, Wesley Centre Development Lead, said: 'We're delighted to host Julian Lloyd Webber in what we hope will kick start an exciting programme of live events, something we plan to build on once the Centre refurbishment is complete.


Lay Pastor

Focus on Prayer

O thou by whom we come to God The Life, the Truth, the Way The path of prayer thyself hast trod Lord, teach us how to pray
